INTRODUCTION.

The Hearth Tax was of French origin introduced into England at the Restoration. In 1660 a yearly allowance of £1,200,000 was granted to Charles II. Certain changes were made in the sources from which this revenue was to be collected. In the place of feudal dues and profits from the demesne the King was granted the perpetual excise of beer and ale and a new book of rates, published in 1660, imposed higher duties. The estimated yield from the sources was, however, too optimistic; the taxes collected failed to reach the desired figure and so it was found necessary to levy additional taxation. Among these supplementary taxes were the hearth tax, grants of the subsidy and the poll tax.

In 1662 by 14 Car. II, C. 10¹ it was ordained that "every dwelling and other house, edifice, all lodgings and chambers in the Inns of Court, Inns of Chancery, colleges and other societies . . . shall be chargeable . . . for every fire hearth and stove within every such house edifice chamber and lodging as aforesaid the sum of 2*s.* by the year, to be paid in two half yearly instalments." The act then proceeds to outline the machinery of assessment and collection. Within six days from receiving notice every owner or occupier must deliver to the constable of his parish an account in writing of the number of his hearths. By the last day of May the constables are empowered to enter up the accounts; where no return has been made they must enter the dwelling and count the hearths for themselves. Failure on the constable's part will be met by a fine of £5 for every week's delay and 40*s.* for every hearth

falsely returned or omitted. At the next meeting of quarter sessions the constables are to deliver their returns to the magistrates who will give them to the Clerk of the Peace in order that two complete rolls may be compiled. The duplicate, duly signed and sealed by three or more justices, must be sent to the Exchequer. The penalty for non-compliance on the Clerk's part shall be £200 for the first month's delay and loss of office for subsequent failure.

The collection of the taxes in half-yearly payments is entrusted to the petty constables who are empowered to distrain on the goods of those refusing to pay. The sums so collected, less 2*d.* in the £ as wages, are to be handed over to the High Constable. The latter is allowed 1*d.* in the £ as his perquisite. Thence the tax goes to the sheriff, who deducts 3*d.* in the £ for himself and 1*d.* for the Clerk of the Peace, and finally pays the money into the Exchequer. Under the act certain types of people are exempt from payment; those who do not contribute to church and poor rate by reason of their poverty or who are in receipt of alms themselves, whose houses are worth less than 20*s.* a year or who have land, tenements, or goods and chattels of less value than £10 are not taxable. Certain types of hearths, blowing houses, ovens, furnaces and kilns are exempt as are also almshouses whose yearly income is less than £100.

This act of 1662 was modified on two subsequent occasions. In 1663 by 15 Car. II, C. 13¹ it was observed that the constables and other officers had been guilty of negligence and that new checks were to be introduced in each stage of the assessment. The petty constable accompanied by "two other substantial inhabitants" must now personally inspect all hearths before making his return, marking in his book all hearths whether taxable or not. The High Constable must inspect and compare these accounts before submitting them to the two nearest

justices who are empowered to examine all officers on oath "concerning the truth and faithfulness of their returns."

Even this tightening up of the assessment does not seem to have been satisfactory since in the next year by the Act of 16 Car. II, C. 3¹ far more drastic amendments were made. In future the returns shall be made not by the petty constable or tithing men but by a new set of officers, chimney men, specially appointed for the purpose ; any violence against them will be punishable by imprisonment. Persons who have let out part of their property in order to claim exemption are still liable for duty. Concealment of hearths is to be punished by double duty.

The Oxfordshire hearth tax returns deposited in the Exchequer are by no means complete. There are three rolls preserved at the Public Record Office, one for 1662 (Lay Subsidy 164/504) and two for 1665 (Lay Subsidy 164/513 and 164/514). The 1662 roll is mutilated, the edges having been so badly damaged that in many cases the right hand column containing the number of hearths and the left hand column giving the total for each parish are both missing.

The two rolls for 1665 are not identical, nor do they agree with that of 1662. Dr. Salter editing the hearth tax for Oxford² used 164/514 which he considered by far the best record. Where, however, a return is required for the whole county 164/513 has proved the better roll since Dr. Salter's MS. is not perfect ; the first sheet is completely missing, the second so faded as to be almost illegible, while the last nine membranes are imperfect. The whole roll is much discoloured and far less easily read than 164/513. It is this latter roll, therefore, that has been transcribed in the present volume.

The chief difference between the three returns lies in the number of names in each. That of 1662 contains more than those of 1665. Although the 1662 roll itself is mutilated there

are preserved at the Public Record Office a number of bundles (E.179, 255/4) which contain the petty constables' returns. These run to 296 membranes and have a great deal of interesting detail in them. From both these sources, therefore, it has been possible to get a fairly accurate idea of the 1662 return for the purposes of comparison with the later ones. In Appendix A¹ a list has been compiled of six hundreds to show the variations in the totals returned in the two years.

The chief difference between the two returns for 1665 again lies in the number of names. Roll 164/514 does not include the list of exemptions for each parish. In every case those returned as exempt in the 164/513 manuscript are included as taxable in the other roll. This can be seen by comparing the return printed by Dr. Salter for Oxford city with the list in this volume for the same district.

It is unfortunate that the chimney men's returns for 1665 are not in existence to supplement the Exchequer roll of that year. Since they were officers specially appointed for the purpose it is probable that their returns did not suffer from the many defects of the petty constables. Undoubtedly the first return of 1662 was not accurate and deserves the stricture that economic historians² have placed upon it as unreliable material on which to make any calculations. The Exchequer rolls compiled by the Clerk of the Peace are neat and well written, although even here there are many inconsistencies. The constables' returns for the county on the other hand are often the work of illiterate men who had frequently to leave the writing of the survey to others, contenting themselves with signing, or even with making their mark. Of the returns for the six hundreds of 1662 examined in detail, 67 were drawn up and signed by the constable himself, 33 were written by some one else and only signed by the constable, 24 bear no signature so that it is impossible to ascertain if the constables were

responsible, while 12 bear marks in lieu of signature. In one case at least the Chief Constable of Ewelme was as illiterate as his junior officer. Miss Marshall in her examination of the Bedfordshire returns¹ has found very much the same state of affairs.

The petty constables' returns for 1662 give more detail than the Exchequer roll. The names of houses creep more frequently into the lists. In Appendix C² is compiled a complete list of houses named in the 1665 roll. There are hints of difficulty in collection. At Bicester Market End the constable remarks³ "I was forced to destreyne Robert Golding, Edward Masey ; I could find noe goods to distreine of Anne Burgis and therefore have not quit her in the note." The discharges are carefully signed by the churchwardens and the overseers of the poor and minister of the parish as laid down in the Act. There are examples of returns made by the tithingmen instead of the petty constable as at Soldern and Fifield, or by an inhabitant as at Shelswell. The list for Milton is peculiar in that here every inhabitant signs his own return. This gives an opportunity of discovering how far the general public could sign their names. There are 23 people returned of whom 3 could only set their mark, the rest signing. At Sarsden 5 out of 13 make their mark. Two letters are worth transcribing in full since they show a certain agitation in the writer's mind. The first comes from Ploughly hundred.⁴ "Sir William Cob this is to sertify you concerning all the fire harthes that are in the liberty of Boycott there ar but six upon my truth and fidelity sir there being som mistake obtaineth mee to sertyfi you upon atruth your loving sarvant John Miller." The other letter⁵ bears no record of its district, though its place in the bundles suggests that it may refer to Northley. "In the house of Richard Knis was three hathes where by it hapned a sad

acsydent by fire thay are burned doune to the grounde and there [are] no distres nor nothing to bee had."

It is impossible to say, since none of them are preserved, whether the local returns that form the basis of the 1665 roll were as badly written, blotted and mis-spelt as the work of the petty constables. Nevertheless the Exchequer roll itself is not free from mistakes. The Clerk of the Peace responsible for the compilation was Richard Stevens who received £40 for his pains in 1664¹; the sheriff for 1665 was Thomas Wheate, Esq., of Glympton Park,² and the receiver of the tax was Mark Cottle. There is much inconsistency in the spelling of names. The same name may be spelt in three different ways in the same parish, Symonds, Symons, Cresswell and Cressell, Mellecheepe, Mellechep, Mellechepp, Liddyatt, Lydiat, Liddiatt and Lydyatt will suffice to show the variations of what must have been the same family name. There are examples, though not frequent, of wrong additions in the totals, as in the returns for Studley, Caversham and Wiggington. All corrections in this return that are in square brackets are the work of the editor. Other corrections, and there are plenty, were obviously the work of the justices, Sir Thomas Peniston and Sir William Walter to whom the roll was submitted at quarter sessions, or of the Exchequer officials at a later stage in the proceedings.

It is possible that the Clerk of the Peace used the returns of an earlier roll since there are two occasions at least in which the 1665 return has not been brought up to date. The Henry, Viscount Falkland returned for Sandford and Great Tew was the third viscount who died on April 2, 1663; the return should therefore have been for Anthony his heir. Similarly William Knollys of Rotherfield Greys, M.P. for Oxfordshire in 1663, died in the next year.

Mention must also be made of another puzzling feature in the entries, the repetition of the same name several times. For example in the parish of Watlington¹ Thomas Bartlett is mentioned once for five hearths, again for four and then for three, three times for a single hearth, finally for two. Admittedly there were two men of the same name in the village since the clerk differentiates by adding "senior" and "junior" the first time the names appear. In all there are seven entries under the same name. Nor is this the only time. In Great Haseley² John New is returned with one and then with two hearths. In the next village he has three hearths, while in Baldwin Brightwell he has again three. Many other examples of the same reduplication can be cited. The Act expressly states that the occupier is liable to taxation but it does appear, in these cases at least, that it is the owner who has been returned, unless either the constable is guilty of carelessness or there are several people with identical names. At other times when a mistake has been made and a name duplicated, the error is so obvious as to be safely classified as a mistake.

The actual date at which the assessment return was completed is not recorded. The heading says that it was for the half year ending at the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel 1665. The heading of the 1662 roll says that the return was made on the Tuesday after Michaelmas. Yet the earliest of the constables' returns from which it was compiled was dated August 11th and the latest November 26th. In this case the supposition that the list was drawn up in early October may be placing the date a little too early in the year.

That the hearth tax was unpopular is indisputable. It was of foreign origin and touched a new class of persons hitherto practically out of range of the direct taxation of the subsidies. In Appendix B is printed a lay subsidy return for the hundred of Bullington made in 1663 when the King was granted four

subsidies by the clergy and four by the laity. Although the rate of taxation was higher than the hearth tax at 4s. in the £ on property and 2s. 8d. on goods, far fewer people were liable. For example only four people are assessed for Marsh Baldon ; another ten become liable under the hearth tax. Not only did the poorer classes feel themselves oppressed by the hearth tax but there was the fact that an estate of £30 a year paid the same rate as one of 30s. The fact that the larger number of hearths in the more important mansions constituted an attempt at a sliding scale did little to remove this sense of grievance. So far then there was a certain justice in the words of the repealing Act of 1689, 1 Wm. & Mary, C 10, that the tax was a "great oppression to the poorer sort." Moreover the inspection of his house by a stranger was keenly resented by the average man. That this inspection was necessary is undeniable since the householders adopted many stratagems to avoid payment. They refused to make returns or to allow the officers to enter their premises ; they stopped up their chimneys or pulled them down. The fact that a clause was needed in the second Act making all concealment a punishable crime shows how widespread were the evasions.

Another source of trouble was the provision for exemption. Nothing emerges so strikingly from a comparison of the Oxfordshire returns of 1662 and 1665 as the increase in the number of people no longer liable. In only one case in all the parishes in the six hundreds examined in detail, that of Caversham, has there been an appreciable increase of forty names ; in three other instances the increase is of a single or two persons. In all the other villages far fewer people are returned, a decline often as great as 50 per cent. in the number. At times the exemption certificates seem to have been granted wholesale. Two examples quoted in the *Calendar of Treasury Books*, although not dealing with Oxfordshire, illustrate this. In 1668 the receiver for Cornwall disallowed certificates to the

value of £360 granted over two years.¹ In Salisbury alone 800 certificates of exemption were refused.² Miss Marshall cites³ the case of the churchwardens of St. Botolph's, Aldgate, going as far as to sell certificates, and the admonitions which the bishops were urged to utter to clergy and churchwardens against indiscriminate granting of exemptions suggest that the officials of St. Botolph's were not the only criminals.

Both the householder and the collector of the tax were loud in their abuses of each other. The householder, when he could not resist the chimney men's intrusion or conceal some of his chimneys, did at times use force against the hated officials. In 1665 the Lord Treasurer Southampton, anticipating difficulty, wrote to the justices for Lancashire⁴ urging them to assist by all possible means the collector appointed for their county to overcome "the opposition which he will probably meet with" and also to appoint "times and places in each hundred when and where appeals on differences may be brought before them." The justices appear reluctant to support the collectors. Jonathan Trelawny complained⁵ that "the people are making their returns and have been walling up their chimneys . . . they give in good estates as so decayed so that the returns will not be half what they were at first. The fault lies with the justices, who are willing to take anything the country brings in . . . this is not so much through disaffection as a numbness on their spirits." Numbness of spirit was hardly the failing of some of the justices who went so far as to countenance, and even to encourage popular resistance to the collectors. At Marlborough the chimney men, while distraining, were attacked and could get no redress on appeal to the magistrates save that the defaulter should pay the

duty for which he was liable ; neither penalty nor damages being added. The State Papers are full of riots and violence. In 1668 a collector at Bridport¹ died from wounds inflicted by a stone thrown at him by the rabble, while in the execution of his duty. Complaints were lodged that the Gloucestershire collectors performed their duties with swords by their sides and pistols in their hands.² This is not surprising when Thomas Veele, the receiver of the county, complained of "great contempt and abuses violently done him in the execution of his office."³ The officials in Norfolk said that they worked at the hazard of their lives.⁴

Rudeness seems to have been met with rudeness. So great were the complaints that two years after the hearth tax return here printed, the Privy Council investigated many allegations of oppression. They heard complaints that people had been made to pay on what could not be classed as hearths, wool carders' earthenware pots for example ; that arrears had been extorted for three or four years back ; that people had to go miles from their homes to meet the collectors who, to quote a complaint from Bristol, "cause great murmuring by going on purpose to demand the duty when persons are from home, and then breaking open the house, taking the distress, and making them pay twice the value to redeem it ; so they served the Dean of the place, elect Bishop of St. Asaph, by seizing some of his plate when he was absent, dining at the Mayor's."⁵ In this long battle of complaint and counter-complaint Oxfordshire does not appear in the State Papers. During the winter of 1666-7 popular feeling expressed itself in riots in at least thirteen parts of England but there is no mention of resistance in Oxford. Nevertheless the county does not seem to have been completely exemplary. In 1665 the Lord Treasurer had to

send a circular letter¹ to all clerks of the peace to deliver to the justices at the next quarter sessions urging them to desist from granting illegal exemptions. In December of the same year warrants of arrest were issued for the sheriffs of sixteen counties for arrears of hearth money.² Oxford is not among the counties. Eighteen months later a number of receivers, including Robert Knowles, receiver for the county of Oxford, were to be sent for, and inquiries to be made if Knowles were dead.³ A month later came the order to stay proceedings against the late Knowles⁴ and to arrest Ralph Saunders, receiver for Oxford.⁵ From this it can be deduced that the collection of the hearth money was not wholly satisfactory in Oxfordshire.

It would be idle to suggest that the hearth tax returns furnish a completely reliable census of all householders for the county. Nevertheless this type of document has its very obvious uses. It does at least furnish a record of the greater number of families living in each parish which is valuable for the genealogist, and it gives a picture of the size of the houses of the time.

In this return for Oxfordshire appear a number of important people. There is the Lord Chancellor of England, Edward, Earl of Clarendon, living at Cornbury in the parish of Charlbury, and returned with forty-three hearths, the largest mansion in the county, as befitted a man who was at the same time Chancellor of the University and Lord Lieutenant of the county. Lord Abergavenny is returned for Shirburn Castle and Lord Anglesey has a house of thirty hearths. Other peers who had property in the county are Henry, Lord Arundel, Lord Craven, Thomas, Earl of Downe, Viscount Falkland, the Earl of Lindsey, the Duke of Richmond, Viscount Saye and Sele and Lord Wenman of Thame Park.

Men who had been active during the Interregnum and important royalists are both represented. Lord Saye and Sele and Sir John Glynn of Bicester were both among Cromwell's chief supporters. Lord Wenman was one of the commissioners to carry the proposals of peace to the King at Oxford, Uxbridge and Newport. The house of Unton Croke at Marston was used during the proposals for the surrender of Oxford; his son Richard was one of the commissioners to survey and sell the King's manor and farms at Woodstock. Another of the family, Bulstrode Whitlocke was one of Cromwell's most famous ambassadors. William Draper of Nether Worton served on the Sequestration Committee for the county. Another important family resident in Oxfordshire was that of Speaker Lenthall of Burford Priory. William Lenthall himself had died in 1662 but his son John, M.P. for Gloucester in the Long Parliament and sheriff in 1672, appears in the return.

Among the royalists who are mentioned are Roger Brest of Thrupp, Lord Lindsey and William Knollys of Rotherfield Greys all of whom compounded for delinquency during the Interregnum. Lord Craven's lands at Caversham were confiscated and sold. The Duke of Richmond, 5th Baron Newbury, returned for Piddington, succeeded to the title when his father was slain fighting for the King in 1642. Lord Falkland and Sir William Morton of Kidlington both suffered imprisonment for the same cause.

A number of the men mentioned in this return were, or had been, members of parliament. The members for the county in 1665 were Sir Anthony Cope and Sir Francis Wenman; for the city of Oxford Richard Croke the Recorder and Brome Whorwood of Headington and Holton; for the University the Hon. Lawrence Hyde, second son of the Earl of Clarendon and Sir Heneage Finch, neither of whom appears as taxed. In Appendix E is printed the parliamentary experience of other Oxfordshire men. In addition to duties at Westminster many of the men returned for the hearth tax had themselves

an interest in other forms of taxation having served as commissioners of the subsidy granted to the King in 1663,¹ and for an aid granted in 1664/5.² Not all the commissioners for these two levies, however, appear in the hearth tax return for the next year so that they cannot all have owned houses in the county.

The total number of houses given by the 1665 tax return as either taxable or discharged is 7,461, of which 52 were uninhabited and 7 shared. It has already been suggested that this is certainly an understatement owing to growing unwillingness to declare hearths and other manner of fraud. Even if this figure is increased by half as much again, which is a most generous allowance based on the difference between the returns for 1665 and 1662, the total number of houses in the county falls far short of that mentioned by Chamberlayne in 1700, in the nineteenth edition of the *Notitiæ Angliæ*, where he gives 19,007 houses. Another source of information for the houses in a particular town comes from Mr. Gretton's analysis of the Burgage Rent Roll³ of 1685 for Burford. In that year he believes that the total population of the town, on a basis of 180 households, was 900. The 1662 hearth tax return gives only 144 householders; the 1665, 99 names. The difference between 1662 and 1685 may represent the growth of the town over twenty years but these figures show how the evidence from the hearth taxes is not confirmed from other sources. There also exists a poll tax return for Taynton made in 1666,⁴ wherein the collectors give 52 families while the hearth tax of 1665 gives only 23, and that of 1662, 34.

Thus it can be seen that any calculation of the population of the county based on the hearth tax evidence depends on two

uncertainties ; that the return is made out for the house and not for the family, and that the number of houses itself may not be accurate. Various suggestions have been put forward for the size of the average family. The Taynton return mentions 156 people in 52 households, thus giving an average of just 3. Gregory King in his *State and Condition of England*, published in 1696, gives 4.25 as the family.¹ William Petty in his two studies in population gives 8,² subsequently modified to 6-6 $\frac{1}{3}$.³ Later writers suggest equally varying figures. S. H. A. Hervey editing a Suffolk hearth tax takes 5⁴ as the size of the family. Mr. Gretton writing of Burford accepts the same figure. Miss Marshall basing her calculations on the evidence of the 1676 religious census made to show religious dissent believes that Gregory King's suggestion of 4.25 is the true one.⁵ Even if this is accepted there still remains the fact that no complete list of houses is in existence. In Appendix F the population for three hundreds for 1662 based on the hearth tax return has been calculated and the figures for the first official census of 1801 are also given to show the rise in population in just over a century and a quarter. This rise may appear greater than it actually was since the 1662 figures are possibly an underestimate. To use the 1665 figures would be to intensify this error. Thus all population calculations which are based on hearth tax returns can only be, at best, indicative, and not positive figures.

The taxation returns have one other value for the ecclesiastical historian. At first sight it seems curious that so few parish ministers are mentioned. The occasional title of "Doctor" or "Clerk" suggests that here may be the incumbent. The records of the diocese of Oxford do not furnish complete lists of the vicars and rectors of the county. From them however

it has been possible to identify a number of men who are listed without any distinguishing mark, as the holder of that living. In certain cases the hearth tax return, or the exemption certificate signed by the vicar in 1662, supplements the diocesan information and helps to fill some of the many blanks.

The period is moreover one of particular importance since the Restoration settlement and the operation of the Clarendon Code resulted in the forfeiture or dismissal from office of many of the Presbyterian ministers. In certain instances the 1665 return does not appear to be strictly accurate. The Bishop's Act Book gives the names of men instituted to their livings in 1663 whereas the return two years later still preserves the earlier incumbent. It is possible that the new man had not yet come to the living but far more likely that the clerk copied an earlier roll since this same inaccuracy has been pointed out in the case of men known to be dead, like Viscount Falkland or William Knollys.

In conclusion a word must be said about the transcription of this roll. The Clerk of the Peace not only indulged in many variations of spelling, but also used abbreviations which were not always consistent. Sometimes he put "discharged by poverty" in full, sometime "disch. by poverty" or "dis. by pov."; he used every combination possible. At times he wrote "widdow" or "widd." It has been thought better to adopt a uniform practice in the transcription and ignore such abbreviations. Where parish registers have been printed these have been consulted for additional information about the men mentioned in the return. There are not, however, many of these, so that these notes are not as numerous as might be obtained from a more exhaustive use of manuscript registers. The footnote "Parish Register" refers to *Oxfordshire Parish Registers*, edited by W. P. W. Phillimore in 1909. If the information comes from any other printed parish register the reference is given in full, as for Kidlington which is printed in

Volume 24 of the Oxford Historical Society publications. The footnote "Oxford Diocesan MS. list" refers to a manuscript compilation of the vicars and rectors of the various livings which the registrar of the diocese kindly allowed me to consult. If a man is noted as being a "Taxation Commissioner 1663," it means that his name appears among the commissioners for the subsidy of 1663, *Statutes of the Realm*, Vol. V, p. 465; or if a commissioner in the following years, he served for the aid granted in 1664 and 1665, see p. 538. The note "Constable," "Churchwarden," or "Overseer of the poor 1662," means that the man signed the early hearth tax return in this capacity. This information comes from P.R.O. E. 179, 255/4. Another reference in the notes is to a Harleian Society publication, Vol. 5, 1871, *Herald's Visitation of Oxfordshire*. The visitation is that of 1634. When descendants of those mentioned in the visitation appear in the hearth tax a page reference to the Harleian Society volume is given.

RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

I.—The Society shall be called THE OXFORDSHIRE RECORD SOCIETY.

II.—The object of the Society shall be to print and distribute to subscribers such documents relating to the history of the County of Oxford as have not been previously edited; to print other material relating to the history of the County; and to endeavour to give advice and assistance to custodians of historical records for the care and preservation of such records.

III.—The Annual Subscription shall be half-a-guinea payable in advance on the first of January. The annual subscription may be commuted for a single subscription of seven guineas. After 200 members have joined the Society an entrance fee of five shillings may be charged.

IV.—Each member of the Society, having paid his or her subscription, shall be entitled to a copy of every work produced by the Society, and to vote at the general meetings held within the period subscribed for.

V.—The Management of the Society shall be vested in a Council consisting of not less than six, nor more than twenty ordinary members, together with the President, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary and Hon. General Editor, as ex-officio members, all to be elected at the Annual General Meeting. An editorial sub-committee of the Council shall assist the Hon. General Editor. Vacancies occurring between the general meetings may be filled by the Council itself.

VI.—A General Meeting of subscribers shall be held annually in Oxford to receive the Hon. Secretary's report of the work of the Society, and the Hon. Treasurer's financial statement; to elect officers for the ensuing year; and to transact the business of the Society generally. Notice of any other business to be brought forward shall be given to the Hon. Secretary in the course of the preceding December. A special general meeting may be held at any time by direction of the Council, or on request of not less than ten members of the Society in writing.

VII.—The Council shall meet at least once in every year, and at such times as may be deemed necessary by itself. Three members, excluding the Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary and Hon. General Editor, shall form a quorum.
