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## INTRODUCTION.

### PART II.

The proceedings recorded in this Act Book were mainly the outcome of presentments made at the Archdeacon's bi-annual visitations. It is unfortunate that no articles of enquiry for 1583–1584 for the diocese or archdeaconry of Oxford are known to survive<sup>1</sup>; but to a great extent they may be inferred from the cases which came before the Court as a result of them; and, as elsewhere throughout the reign, they would be largely influenced by the Royal Articles and Injunctions of 1559, supplemented by the Admonition of 1560, the Advertisements of 1566 and the canons of 1571. It is against the background of these regulations that the cases should be considered, for the wider significance of ecclesiastical court records lies precisely in the material they provide for the study of the actual execution of administrative orders.<sup>2</sup>

No one reading the present volume can doubt that at all events in the archdeaconry of Oxford in the year 1583–1584 there was a serious effort to make these orders effective. The supervision of all classes, the clergy, the church officials and the ordinary laity was thorough-going, and the business of the court was pursued with diligence and in detail. The administration of the diocese was indeed efficient during most of the reign, but even so, this particular year is to some extent exceptional. Archbishop Whitgift had just begun his vigorous rule and was already making his influence everywhere felt: not least in the diocese of

Oxford. Following the issue in October, 1583, of his celebrated articles and a letter to all the bishops containing a scheme of reform and asking for particulars of the state of the church and clergy, the Archbishop addressed another letter of the same import to Dr. Griffith Lloyd, guardian of the spiritualities during the vacancy of the see.<sup>1</sup>. The results are reflected in the present Act Book : compared with other similar books of the period the volume of business is considerably larger and there is much evidence of increased care both in presentment and in the prosecution of cases.

How far does a record such as this represent the actual state of affairs ? This is a big question and a much wider study of ecclesiastical court records generally is first required before sound canons for their criticism may be evolved. But towards an answer I would put forward a few elementary considerations.

First there are the actual conditions in which churchwardens and ministers framed their presentments. They were dealing with tiny worlds where each was intimately known to each ; nothing could be hidden from them ; and they could not have been uninfluenced by the gossip which prevailed in small communities then as now. The churchwardens had but a brief authority : a short time and they reverted to the ranks. And if while in office they were exposed to abuse, when out of it they might expect retaliation : there were many temptations to turn the blind eye and the deaf ear.

In the proceedings themselves, in the presentments which were actually followed by citations to court, there is a striking lack of uniformity. Emphasis appears to have been laid upon different faults at different times in different places : in fact something very like "campaigns" seem to have been held.

Again it is impossible to regard as innocent all those who were dismissed or (especially) those who were declared to have purged themselves. The judge of a spiritual court was no more fallible than the judge of any other and the system itself had flaws.

But, taking these factors into account and bearing in mind that penal court records of any kind admittedly deal with the less reputable side of life, at the same time making allowance for the checks and balances which obtained in the 16th century country parish, I think we have here what is, upon the whole, a remarkably faithful record and one moreover from which it is possible to gather facts which are typical for the diocese as a whole.

In the discussion which follows the cases are arranged according to the classes of the persons accused and within that according to the types of offence. The clergy and church officials are dealt with in some detail. The cases used as illustrations are chosen because they require an explanation or reference or identification of some kind which could not be included in the footnotes to the text which are reserved in the main for textual matters ; and because at the same time they are typical.

#### THE CLERGY.

Act books of church courts are pretty sure guides on all matters to do with the clergy, for of all people they were the least likely to escape notice and detection. The incumbents were usually of a far better type than the curates, who were often half-literate, ill-paid hirelings constantly on the move from place to place.<sup>1</sup>

We have two cases of neglect of church services on weekdays ; there is none of neglect on Sundays. Thomas Elye, curate of Horsepath, admits the charge but pleads the legitimate excuse that he is a student in Oxford.<sup>2</sup> John Wheeler, the Puritan

curate of Hanwell, is accused of not reading services on Fridays and Saturdays.<sup>1</sup> It is interesting to notice that the churchwardens refused to present him : Hanwell under the Copes was probably puritan to a man.

The charge of serving two cures is brought against the vicar of Churchill, Richard Bagley, and Hugh Richards, curate of Goring. Bagley admits that for two years he has been serving Sarsden as well as his own parish and is admonished not to do so. Richards, accused of serving also at Basildon, just over the river in Berkshire, says that having been asked to do the duty by the vicar of Basildon who has long been troubled either with "matters of lawe or sicknes" he did so now and then, but only so that service was performed in both places "in good and convenient tyme daylie."

There is only one case of neglect to wear the surplice<sup>2</sup> and that is not one of downright refusal. Richard Bagley, the vicar of Churchill just mentioned, says that he sometimes wears it and sometimes does not. He is admonished to wear it regularly. It looks like a case of slackness. Usually, but by no means always, disuse of this vestment may be taken to imply puritanism, and we might have expected more trouble over it in North Oxfordshire. But apart from Banbury and the immediate neighbourhood I do not think that the puritans were anything like as strong in this district as is often supposed. The many evidences—there are some in this book—of a clinging to old ways and beliefs point all the other way.

Throughout the reign great stress was laid upon the regular preaching of the quarterly sermons. There is but one case of neglect of them here : that in which John Wright, curate of

Stanton Harcourt, explains that although the sermons are not preached in South Leigh chapel, they are in the parish church. As for South Leigh, Wright says (speaking on October 3) that there had been a sermon by Master Emmott<sup>1</sup> before Midsummer ; and further that the Catechism is taught and shall be taught in the future " so farre forthe as tyme and leasure shall serve him." It is impossible to say whether neglect of teaching the catechism had also been alleged : if so it is the only case in this book. But the fact that such an indifferent answer was accepted by the judge is instructive : it goes with other evidence to show that in spite of frequent enquiries there does not seem to have been any such marked insistence upon the regular teaching of the catechism in this diocese as we find later under Laud.<sup>2</sup>

Marriage in the prohibited seasons was not forbidden by any Reformation or post-Reformation canon or constitution, but the older canon law was widely obeyed and questions were asked on the subject in several known sets of visitation articles.<sup>3</sup> Thomas Bradlie, curate of Charlbury and John Higgens, curate of Chadlington, are accused of marrying in Advent. We may take this as almost certain evidence of the puritanism of these two clergy, for among the puritans the observance of the rule was regarded as popish.<sup>4</sup> Incidentally we may also infer that one of the Oxford articles dealt with seasons of marriage.

Lewis Evans, the rector of Ducklington, is called to answer for the sad condition of Cokethorpe chapel.<sup>1</sup> Through his curate, John Floide, he admits that it is in "great decaye" and has been so "ever since the suppression of the abbeyes." He pleads that he is not bound to do the repairs as Cokethorpe is but a chapel of ease. We are fortunate in having the record of a visitation of the archdeaconry in 1540.<sup>2</sup> From it we learn something of the state of the chapel and that repairs were by custom the responsibility of the rector of Ducklington. The window of the chancel above the sacrament of the eucharist was then said to be broken so that the rain fell within a foot of the sacrament "culpa magistri doctoris Leson rectoris de Ducklyntone qui ex antiqua legitima precepta consuetudine dictum cancellum reparare tenetur." The case is an interesting sidelight on the fate of chapels of ease generally at this time. Throughout the country many were destroyed or allowed to fall into ruin. But in the 1580's there were signs that the authorities were trying to put a stop to this<sup>3</sup> and the case about Cokethorpe is perhaps a hint that some such efforts were being made in Oxfordshire.

Neglect of chancel repairs is also alleged against the rector of Noke, Robert Warland; and Hugh Henshaw, rector of Mixbury, has to answer for his share of the church mounds.

As will be seen later, there is a good deal of evidence in this book of the careful enforcement of the rules safeguarding marriage. John Foxley, vicar of Beckley, is the only cleric directly involved and he denies that he solemnized matrimony between a couple at Dumbleton (Glos.), in Binsey or elsewhere.

Turning to the moral faults of the clergy, there are five accused of incontinence. The curates Robert Hiat of Bampton and Richard Palmer of Brize Norton seem to have been a bright pair. We first find them mixed up in an unseemly row with William Woodward on the way from Lew to Bampton ; then later Hiat is involved with one Jane Pusie and is paying for her child's maintenance, and Palmer is in trouble over a certain Dorothy Maye.

The case against Richard Bagley, vicar of Churchill, is confusing. It is not certain that he was guilty, for although there is no record that he purged himself as ordered, we find him entered as dismissed. Shortly after, however, he gravely certifies the performance of the woman's penance.

Mr. Wright, vicar of Lewknor, is cited for allowing the misbehaviour of his servants while they were under his roof. Whether he knew about it or not we cannot tell, but the case is a small indication of the standards of " respectability " demanded of the parochial clergy.

The curate of Horton, Henry Wise, is dismissed on the charge of incontinence ; then he answers *seriatim* to indictments which no doubt reflect one or more of the Oxford enquiries as to clerical behaviour. He denies that he is a quarreller, tables player, dice player or given to ribald talk ; and is dismissed with a monition.<sup>1</sup>

The offence of Roger Norwood, rector of Rowsham, is the somewhat unusual one of keeping a church bible for his own use : if he wanted it for study surely very excusable. But it shows how jealously church property was guarded, for every penny counted when the income at the disposal of most villages was very small and left a very narrow margin.

#### THE CHURCHWARDENS.

The churchwardens were the most important officials in the

parish, for upon them chiefly fell the responsibility of its good government. In this volume we see them about their manifold duties.

One of the most important of these was the maintenance in good repair of the church fabrics. Orders on this subject are constant throughout the reign and great efforts were made for the improvement of the deplorable state in which the churches were at the beginning of the reign—and later, for besides previous long and gross neglect the iconoclasm of the early 1560's left deep scars on walls, windows and sanctuary floors. It is clear that much had been done towards betterment in Oxfordshire by 1584.

It may be well to point out that when in visitation and court records a church is said to be "in decay" or "ruinous" or to have this or that amiss, we should not at once assume the worst. After all, there are few churches even to-day which have not something broken or missing somewhere. And in fact, most of the defects reported in this volume are minor ones.

At Wigginton the churchwardens confess to "decay" but say they are already doing repairs which will be completed within three weeks.

The trouble was a little more serious at Ipsden. At first it was alleged that the north side was "almost downe and unslatted," but when the churchwardens appear at the next session it turns out that what was amiss on the north side of the church was a building which was in a bad state because there was now no use for it and the timber had been used to repair another house for the parish. We probably have here an old and a new church house. It was the church itself which was unslatted. The wardens admit this and are ordered to rectify the matter before Michaelmas.

In six churches there are alleged to be broken windows, but in all save one it appears upon examination that the damage is not extensive. The windows at Spelsbury are "sumwhat in decaye"; at Charlbury it is asserted that they are "repayred sufficiently";

at Chadlington the windows are admitted to be broken, but the churchwarden who appears undertakes that they "shal be shortlye repayred"; at Wood Eaton it is protested that the windows are in good condition "other than the lack of a quarell or suche a like thing"; at St. Peter's-in-the-East the only disrepair is "a hole or two made by lewde children with throwinge of stones," and a glasier has been seen about it. On the other hand much attention is needed to the windows of Eynsham church, for repairs were necessary twelve months before and nothing was done. However, one of the wardens appears on the next court day and promises amendment.

At Spelsbury, Charlbury, Chadlington and Shorthampton there are no sentences of scripture painted on the walls.<sup>1</sup> This evidently was ordered throughout the country; although there was no mention of it in the Royal Articles and Injunctions of 1559 it was prescribed in several dioceses from 1552 onwards, and it is an indication of previous general practice that these sentences were ordered by the canon of 1604.<sup>2</sup>

The churchwardens of Pyrton are charged with failing to certify the carrying out of repairs which had been ordered. It is one of the many examples of how closely the court pursued the details of a case.<sup>3</sup>

The keeping of the churchyard fence in order must have been a troublesome business for the churchwardens even where the apportionments were set out in writing, as they probably were in many places.<sup>4</sup> There are faulty "mounds" reported from Wolvercote and Wheatley.

At Wheatley the chapel also needs attention in tiles, glass and stonework.

Another duty of churchwardens was the provision of church furniture and goods.<sup>1</sup> This was particularly onerous during the reign of Elizabeth when several items which have since become characteristic of the English church had then to be found new. Wardens tended to let things like this slide and to leave the unpopular task of levying special rates to their successors.

At Hardwick a bible is lacking and at Elsfield there is no "convenient seat" for the minister. A bible in English was required by the sixth Royal Injunction of 1559, following the Injunction of 1547 and the Act of 1538. It was a costly item, especially for a small place, and the rector, Henry Buckley, undertakes to provide a bible himself. We may speculate about the version. There is at least the possibility that it was the very popular Genevan version which was issued in a convenient size and at a reasonable price: Mr. Buckley may even have had a copy to spare. As for the minister's seat, the first official order was in the Advertisements of 1566 which prescribed that the Common Prayer should be said or sung decently in a convenient place to be decided by the Ordinary. It appears from the well-known paper submitted by Parker to Cecil in 1565<sup>2</sup> that there was much variety in the placing of the seat. The Advertisements by leaving the matter to the discretion of each bishop did not make for any greater uniformity and for many years the varieties continued. This case from Elsfield gives a hint of the arrangements in the diocese of Oxford, for we learn that the churchwarden is ordered to make within a month a seat for the minister "prope cancellum."

The responsibility of preserving reverence and decency in the church and the churchyard rested also primarily with the churchwardens.<sup>1</sup> In spite of prohibitions which have a history long before Elizabethan times churchyards especially continued to be used for all kinds of mundane purposes, and old customs died hard. In this book we find the churchwardens of Bourton called to answer for allowing dancing and bowling in the churchyard ; those of South Stoke and Goring are charged with allowing people to dance and pigs to dig there ; at Goring there is bowling also. The Goring wardens confess and are dismissed with a monition ; from those of South Stoke a denial is accepted and they are dismissed.

A most interesting case is that in which John Castell and Robert Mesie, wardens of Duns Tew, are before the court for allowing interludes and plays in the church, for brawling about the same with "one old Poulton" and for tolerating shooting and gaming in the churchyard during evening prayer on the wake day. The wardens, appearing on October 31, admit that there was an interlude played in the church on a Saturday about three weeks or a month before, but they profess to be ignorant of the players' names, although they say that the play was performed with the consent of Robert Mesie. As for the brawling, they deny it, but John Castell says that Poulton called him "false forsworn knave" and had "burdened" him for presenting his (Poulton's) daughter as a scold : a sidelight, one of several in this book, on what churchwardens had to put up with in the course of their duty. The last part of the charge is admitted and the deposition tells us that "upon the Sundaye after our first Laydie daye"<sup>2</sup> being theire wake daye "<sup>3</sup> certain strangers from neighbouring villages were shooting in the churchyard in the time of divine service.

Churchwardens certainly had their work cut out if they attempted to keep the more exuberant spirits of the parish within decent limits during the festivities of wake days and of Christmas, Whitsuntide and Midsummer when all restraint seems to have been thrown to the winds.<sup>1</sup> Evidently the wise men of Wootton made no such effort. We find them called to account for failing to present "evell rule done in the churche by the lord and ladie on Midsomer day." They reply that they had no lord or lady and that they know of no disorder other than that on Midsummer day the youth of the place were "sumwhat meerie together in crowning of lordes."<sup>2</sup> The case is dismissed without a monition: the judge no doubt felt with the wardens that there were times and seasons.

The framing of presentments must indeed have been a troublesome business and there were many temptations to shelve tricky questions. There are only three cases in which the wardens are bluntly accused of not presenting at all. These come from Hook Norton, Stoke Lyne and Pyrton. The charge against the wardens of Brize Norton is worded differently but comes to the same thing, while from Swerford the return of "omnia bene" is not accepted.

The accusation that Thomas Bennett of Shifford allowed young men to keep ale for their own use seems more properly to do with the secular side of a churchwarden's activities. Bennett denies it, but mentions that a certain John Buttler has a justices' licence to sell ale. This is a case on the border line between the temporal and spiritual jurisdictions. The granting of ale-sellers' licences was certainly the business of quarter sessions, and the churchwarden is involved here probably in connexion with his duty of seeing that there was no tippling in service time.

At South Leigh the churchwardens are involved in a case which

presents some unusual features. At a Christmas communion the curate, John Wright, being about to administer the bread, opened the paper containing it and found there only a bowstring. William Waklet, the warden who provided the bread, is called and protests that he duly delivered it to the parish clerk. How the bowstring came to be there remained a mystery. Why was it put there ? Possibly a mock consecration was intended : such acts of blasphemy were then becoming common among the more extreme puritans. Or it may be that it was only a prank.

#### THE LAITY.

Attendance at church on Sundays and holy days by everyone, together with the reception of the Holy Communion at Easter by all over the age of 16 years was consistently enforced ; indeed to secure this was one of the first aims of ecclesiastical administration.

Mostly, then as now, absence from both the ordinary church services and from holy communion might be put down to slackness ; and often, of course, there were good reasons for absence, like the " occasion of busines verie earnest " pleaded by a Kingham man named Hadland who admitted that he was absent on the Sunday " before St. Hughes daye last," adding that " willfullie he doethe never absent himselfe." An unusual reason for not receiving the holy communion in his own parish church is submitted by Richard Turland of Bloxham who says that he went to Kings Sutton because on account of his inability to say the catechism by heart the vicar of his own parish would not allow him to receive there.<sup>1</sup> Turland asserts (possibly bearing in mind the Royal Injunctions of 1559 which he would be somewhat familiar with from having heard them read in church) that he is not by law bound to do this, but that he can and does read the catechism ; and he is dismissed. In some cases absence may be due to recusancy, but as we know

that the number of "church papists" was large, it is difficult or impossible to be sure about any individual instance.

Reception of the holy communion was a more crucial test, and we know that the excuse put forward by Christopher Boreman of South Newington, that he is not in love and charity with his neighbours, was a stock one with Roman Catholics<sup>1</sup>; but again we cannot be certain, especially as Boreman is careful to add that he does not stay away out of any scruples of religion. In any case, the archdeacon's court was concerned very little with recusants at this time : they were dealt with elsewhere, the poorer sort at quarter sessions—in so far as they were troubled at all—and persons of importance before the High Commission and the Privy Council.<sup>2</sup>

For the question how far the twelvepenny fine ordered by the 1559 Act of Uniformity for absence from church was actually enforced, the evidence in the deposition of Alice Jordeyne of North Aston may have some slight significance. She says that she spoke certain words in anger to the churchwarden because he took away a posnet belonging to her mistress "for a distresse because she came not to churche." This seems to show that churchwardens were sometimes, at any rate, prepared to go to extreme lengths to enforce the fine.

Before leaving the subject of church attendance, mention must be made of the very interesting monition of Winifred Fuller of St. Nicholas' (now St. Thomas'), Oxford, not to "goe to the colledges upon anie Sondayes or holidayes at the tyme of devine service *sub pena juris.*" The origin of the presentment for this offence is probably the Royal Letter which forbade colleges and cathedral closes to women.<sup>3</sup> Dr. Frere says this order had little

or no effect upon visitation articles and injunctions<sup>1</sup>; but this case may mean that in fact it was reflected in the Oxford articles, and raises the speculation whether a similar question may not have been included also in other sets not at present known.

One of the chief causes of unseemly behaviour in church, of which there are many examples here, was the fairly common wrangling about seats. The holding of certain places in church went with the occupation of certain houses and lands in the parish; and if anyone who had no right to do so ventured to sit in one of these reserved seats there was liable to be trouble.<sup>2</sup> The tangles that could arise over seating rights are illustrated in several cases, perhaps the most interesting being that in which the two great families of Peniston and Stanley were involved at Eynsham.<sup>3</sup>

As for the free sittings that remained it was yet another of the churchwardens' duties to allocate these according to the status of the parishioners; and people were expected to sit in the seat assigned to them and nowhere else. One example must suffice. In St. Ebbe's Church at Oxford, there was a deplorable scene when the churchwardens put Margery Hopkins, being a freeman's wife, into the best part of the seat which Barbara Nicholles had occupied by due appointment of the churchwardens for the past five years. The whole scene gives a most vivid insight into the church life of the time.

Another kind of disturbance came from "disguised persons." They might be classed with the lords of misrule who were

sometimes allowed at holiday times to go dancing and playing in churches with unseemly jests and ribaldry.<sup>1</sup> We have what is perhaps an example of this in the case against the alemen Richard Pyme and John Darlinge of Blackthorn, who admit that on Tuesday in Whitsun week during sermon time one William Powell's man of Horton came into church "with a paynted cloth on his back."

Misbehaviour and "brawling"—with or without blows—and scolding in the churchyard were very common : which is not to be wondered at when we remember that it was the regular meeting place for the settlement of all kinds of parish affairs. But the three men of Eynsham, William Boulton, Philip Pikes and Thomas Buckingham were apparently not guilty of any offence when they met in the churchyard on Lammas Day or Eve and discussed the putting of cattle into a Lammas land and the laying down to hay of their meadows.<sup>2</sup> They explain that there was merely a disagreement and they are dismissed.

The little scuffle in Stratton Audley churchyard between Matthew Alder and George Duckett might have been more serious and in court it is actually called a "fray"; but really it was only a tug-of-war for a citation and it was just bad luck that when both men fell Duckett hurt his face on a tree. Alder himself confesses all the details, piously adding—like most churchyard brawlers—that it all happened outside of the procession way.

Everyone had to take his share in one way or another in raising the parish funds. Until towards the end of Elizabeth's reign the money was usually found by indirect means, the most popular being the levying of a certain specified amount of wheat and malt to be used for the church ale. These functions were held as a rule during Whitsuntide and were great drinkings *pro*

*bono publico*. From the depositions of Edmund Harris of Bampton it appears that the churchwardens were expected to go round and collect the malt and wheat : just one more of the many jobs which fell to them.

Sundays and holy days had also to be strictly kept by abstention from servile work ; the canon law distinction between *opera servilia* and *opera liberalia* was still observed. After service in church people went to their sports and games as they had always done.<sup>1</sup> The various excuses put forward for working are often illuminating on the social and industrial life of the time. Especially interesting are the references to the woollen and brewing industries at and around Oxford.<sup>2</sup> Cuthbert Atkinson of St. Peter's in the East says that in winter he sets his rack (i.e. the frame on which cloth was stretched) on Sunday mornings before service as do "moste of the fullers in Englande . . . because otherwyse they cannot kepe promise with theire customers, for that there is somtymes scarse one fayre daye in a whole weeke." The three Charlbury weavers Yewyn Bustian, John Blackamore and Richard Toolie are dismissed although they confess to slight infringements ; so is Thomas Ricotes of Combe who admits that on several Sundays he weighed out wool and took it to Cirencester.

The maintenance in good repair of the churchyard fence, rails, wall, or "mounds" as the boundaries were called in this part of the country, was by custom the responsibility of the occupiers of certain tenements or lands in the parish, each of which had its allocated portion. We may be sure that only a very newcomer like Anthony Perime at Checkendon was ever able to plead ignorance of his duty : it was the kind of thing an occupier would not be left in the dark about for long.

Lay rectors were, of course, responsible for the repair of the chancel. Edmund Maunde of Horton returns the sufficient answer that the chancel at Chesterton is no longer any concern of his as the advowson now belongs to New College, Oxford.<sup>1</sup>

Another source of income were the offerings made in church, especially following the celebration of the holy communion. The case against Richard Alder of Headington is interesting in that he complains of dues being asked while the people were kneeling at the communion. He calls it an "undecent and unreasonable request" and argues that therefore he is not bound to pay. No sentence or monition is entered.

So much for the people's duties. We now turn to their more private concerns.

The charge against William Bigges of Horton is the only one of words spoken in contempt of the court. Not that there was little resentment felt against the church courts and all their ways : there was plenty of it. But in 1584 it was as well not to be too vocal about complaints of this sort. It is disappointing that we are not told what Bigges actually said : we have probably lost rather a gem.

A very large proportion of the cases which came before the ecclesiastical courts were to do with immorality in some form or other. It must be said at once that no valid argument can be founded on statistics formed from these cases, however carefully they may be worked on. But from the incidence of cases we do see how thoroughly the lives of the people were overlooked. The depositions are often valuable for the light they shed upon social conditions ; and they have a jolly Rabelaisian kind of humour which some find very entertaining.

A vivid and complete little picture emerges from the deposition in which Anne Wrigglesworth of Islip denies the making of

defamatory rhymes. The making of rhymes about all kinds of subjects on all sorts of occasions was a very old and widespread custom.<sup>1</sup> They were often invented on the spur of the moment. Probably specially good efforts would stick in the memory and be repeated : Anne Wrigglesworth says she heard this one from Robert Nevett on the way to Oxford market at Christmas time.

Whatever we may think now of the efficacy of the courts christian, the Elizabethan church authorities were confident that they did indeed work *pro salute animae*; and when the whole ecclesiastical judicial system was attacked by the Puritans one of the stock arguments in its defence was that without the church courts in a licentious age passions would go altogether unbridled and vice would run rampant. There is an echo of this in the defence of Thomas Lever against the charge of saying that half the children of Kingston (Blount) were bastards. He pleads that he was only repeating what he heard a preacher at Paul's Cross say about a certain diocese, namely that there were a number of bastards in it and that but for punishment more than half the children in a parish would be bastards. The sermon was possibly one in support of church courts against those who would have abolished them.<sup>2</sup>

The case against John Planstofer of Bicester is an amusing and instructive one of abuse of the clergy. The defendant says that on Sunday, May 3, he was sitting "on his block at the church wall" when Mr. Phipps, the vicar, passed by in the company of a preacher named Saule, and hearing Saule use the words "plague of God," and thinking they referred to himself, he replied, "A plague on a knave." The explanation sounds rather too plausible. But if we assume that Saule was one of the very numerous itinerant preachers who roamed the country and were held in such general contempt, we have here a most interesting concrete

example of the sort of reception they were liable to get in the parishes.<sup>1</sup>

In matrimonial matters the canon law governed all transactions until Lord Hardwick's famous Act of 1753. Briefly, the essential requisite for a valid marriage was the mutual consent of the parties : “*consensus facit matrimonium.*” Consent was signified by betrothal, which was of two kinds : *sponsalia per verba de futuro* and *sponsalia per verba de presenti*. These contracts had to be made in a public place and before witnesses, who were usually friends and neighbours of the couple.<sup>2</sup> At the same time, or sometimes before, tokens of goodwill were exchanged. Until Lord Hardwick's Act precontract was held as a ground for nullity of marriage and was alleged in breach of promise cases. The marriage had to be solemnized *in facie ecclesie* ; otherwise, though valid, it was irregular. In the absence of the threefold publication of banns, a licence had to be obtained.

The part played by friends and neighbours is illustrated in the cases of John Stacie of Sandford and Edward Saule of Adderbury. A good example of a marriage contract comes from Tadmarton in the case involving Alice Butler and John Saman : it is a perfect example of a contract *per verba de presenti*. We have the actual words used and the names of the witnesses. The vivid little scene is completed with the entrance of the venerable old rector<sup>3</sup> to make a solemn confirmation of the proceedings.

Also from Tadmarton comes a case of jactitation (or boasting) of marriage ; but as both the parties deny that there had been any contract or even exchange of tokens they are dismissed.

The cases to do with wills in this volume have no special features of interest. They provide matter likely to be of use to the genealogist, and their incidence shows the wide range of business done in testamentary matters by an archdeacon's court in the course of a year. One reference which seems to call for a note concerns John Coles, junior, and his wife, of Kidlington, about the laying-in of security for their children's legacies. When the payment of a legacy was at a distant date—for example, one to a child upon reaching the age of 21—it was the duty of the parents or guardians to see that the executors gave due security.<sup>1</sup>

Among the mass of the people in Oxfordshire there was a widespread clinging to customs associated with the old religion.<sup>2</sup> Ringing of bells on saints' eves and festival days, against which injunctions constantly inveighed, was one of them. Edmund Clement of Combe is charged with ringing in All Hallows day and excuses himself by saying that he did so because there was a bridal that day, and "not in anie superstition [nor] in anie contempte of the Queen's lawes." The charges of ringing for the "Queen's day" (i.e., her birthday, September 7) are in rather a different category. Robert Heines, the parish clerk of St. Aldate's, Oxford, explains that he caused the bells to be rung to try them out "agaynst the Queenes daye and for none other purpose"; and that when he was forbidden to do so by Dr. Kennall he "stayed the belles."<sup>3</sup>

There was quite a scene at the Queen's day ringing at Halton in the parish of Wheatley, John Cadburye, who was at the ropes, had left his hat on the font. The parson came into the church,

took the hat and threw it out of doors. Whether he did this because of the disrespect shown to the font or because he objected to the ringing or for what other reason we cannot say. But in any case Cadburye was so incensed that he bluntly told the parson “yf that he wolde serve him so in any other place he wolde give him a boxe on the eare.”

The special observance of the other Queen’s day, her Accession day, November 17, originated in Oxfordshire in about 1570.<sup>1</sup> It began with ringing and as time went on the celebration became more elaborate. There is another point of interest about this day. In local churchwardens’ accounts towards the end of the reign the expenditure is described sometimes as for St. Hugh’s day and sometimes as for the Queen’s day. Both fell on November 17. The feast of St. Hugh had always been specially kept in his own diocese of Lincoln and it is possible that in these parts in the later 16th century the saint’s feast gradually became “transferred” to the Queen’s Accession day.

In many places “monuments of superstition” and proscribed church goods survived the constant searchings and successive waves of destruction through being hidden away by those who hoped for yet another turn in the religious tide. Occasionally cases about relics of this sort came before the courts and—especially when the depositions go to any length—we may be sure of finding some valuable information in the act books. Here from Churchill and from Souldern much detail is forthcoming. At Churchill three “copes or vestments,” a chalice and two crosses<sup>2</sup> are mentioned; one of the crosses has been sent to a brass-founder’s in Oxford to be turned into a sanctus bell. Souldern<sup>3</sup> provides a longer list of goods which includes what must at one

time have been a considerable part of the church equipment.<sup>1</sup> There are candlesticks, a bason,<sup>2</sup> a crucifix, handbells, banner cloths, cross-cloths,<sup>3</sup> a palm cloth,<sup>4</sup> a chalice and an Easter sepulchre. It appears that the chalice had been sold seven years before and a communion cup bought.<sup>5</sup> The sepulchre must have been one of the fairly common wooden ones, on a frame and movable, for we learn that it had been used to make a cupboard.

There are a large number of cases in which the charge is not named and we have to be content with some such tantalising phrase as "*prout patet per billam detectionis.*" It would be interesting if, for example, we could learn more about Richard Hanson who says that he had taken from Oriel College a lease of his shops adjoining St. Mary's Church,<sup>6</sup> pays 10*s.* a year rent and is bound by covenant to maintain them. And it is a pity we are left in the dark about the Mores of Adderbury.<sup>7</sup>

### NOTES ON THE CLERGY.
